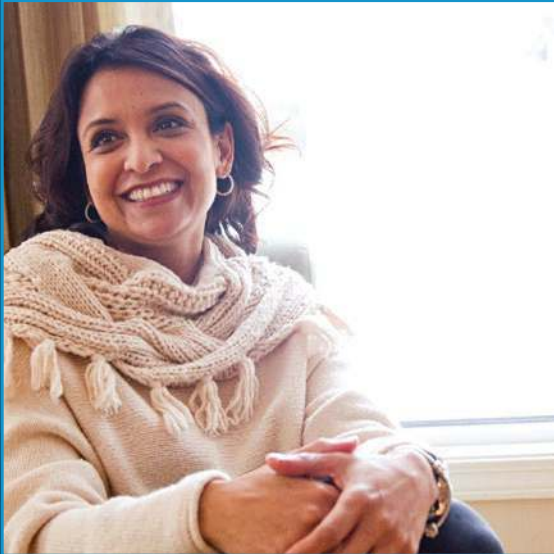

## MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR



The core of community building is leadership. Change begins when we recognize that some aspect of our community needs improvement, and we take action. The Board and staff of the Saskatoon Community Foundation take seriously our responsibility to be leaders, in both our professional and personal lives. Each of us makes a unique contribution to our beloved community of Saskatoon. At the Foundation, the purpose of this leadership is to honour the commitment and steward the gifts of our donors. These donors have created legacies for the good of Saskatoon in perpetuity and have also taken immediate action to address current issues. In turn, these gifts support charities working at ground level to improve the quality of life for all Saskatoon citizens. Our role at SCF is to find innovative, effective and compassionate ways to connect our donors to the causes that matter most to them and the community at large.

Since 1970, the Saskatoon Community Foundation has been building a future for Saskatoon that will last forever. Gifts made today, through endowments, will make our community stronger for future generations. In 2014, thanks to innovative partnerships with community leaders such as the Kinsmen Club and Friends of Gordie Howe Bowl, the Saskatoon Community Foundation was the conduit for unprecedented levels of

donations and grants. Over \$8.4 million in donations was received, resulting in over \$5 million in grants! This brings our total grants since 1970 to over \$19 million! This watershed year brings the assets currently under SCF's management to over \$64 million, almost double the assets managed by SCF five years ago. Investment returns in 2014 were 8.55%, bringing SCF's 20-year average for investment returns to 8.2%.

2014 was a year of new partnerships and growing community awareness of SCF. Our Just in Case program (developed by Harold Empey) and Random Act of Kindness Day raised our profile higher than ever, while innovative partnerships allowed SCF to assist many new donors to achieve their charitable goals. Thanks to all our community partners, whose confidence in SCF was the key to making connections and achieving results. Thanks as well to all those who contributed, either by building permanent endowed funds or by directing their gifts this year to the charities of their choice.

The Saskatoon Community Foundation's PotashCorp Mayor's Cultural Gala was held September 20<sup>th</sup>, 2014. In its eighth year, through the support of our generous title sponsor PotashCorp, and the continued support of our city's wonderful individuals and generous business community, we raised almost \$400,000. Plans are already underway for the 2015 Gala, September 19<sup>th</sup>. We look forward to another incomparable celebration of Saskatoon's diverse culture!

With sadness, we said farewell to two great Saskatonians and former Board members: Cliff Wright, whose contributions to our community simply cannot be calculated, and our good friend Myrna Bentley, who among her other achievements was instrumental in the creation and success of our Mayor's Cultural Gala. Their gifts to Saskatoon will never be forgotten. We also welcomed Ken Juba of Creative Fire and Kim Braun of ScotiaBank to our Board. We look forward to continued success in 2015!

# IN MEMORY

## MYRNA BENTLEY

The Saskatoon Community Foundation lost a great friend and supporter recently. A community leader, pioneer for women in leadership roles and long-time board member of the Saskatoon Community Foundation, Myrna Bentley will be very sadly missed. She served SCF for eight years on our board, including a term as Chair. Myrna was also instrumental in the success of the PotashCorp Mayor's Cultural Gala, making it one of the most successful fundraisers in the history of our community. Myrna took a special interest in making sure the entertainment at some of the early Galas was of the highest possible quality and made sure that the program was packed with value for those attending. But more than that, her cheerful optimism, her focus on family and her kind and generous spirit will always be remembered. We at SCF offer our heartfelt sympathies to the Bentley family and all those who treasured Myrna.



## CLIFF WRIGHT

Cliff Wright's service to our community can hardly be calculated. He was truly a community builder, and not only because his business, Wright Construction, became the largest Saskatchewan-based General contractor. He served for three terms as Mayor, helping to define our community through that era. Perhaps his proudest single achievement in public service was when he was Treaty Land Entitlement Commissioner in the early 1990s and worked with Roland Crowe, Chief of the Federation of Saskatchewan Indian Nations, and the federal and provincial governments to settle long outstanding land claims for twenty-five First Nations in Saskatchewan. His public service was recognized by his appointment to the Saskatchewan Order of Merit and the Order of Canada. He said the most exciting thing for him when he received the Order of Canada was that he was at the same ceremony as Jean Beliveau. By coincidence, his passing follows that of the hockey great by a week. His contributions to Saskatoon and Saskatchewan are innumerable, and we were very fortunate to have him serve on the Board of Directors of the Saskatoon Community Foundation for several years in the 1990s.

## BROADWAY THEATRE:

### **“Back to the Future” – Renovations to Lobby & Concession**

The Saskatoon Community Foundation invests in the rich cultural history and future of our community. The Broadway Theatre is a local heritage landmark, having been a cornerstone of its neighbourhood since it was built in 1946. SCF's 2014 Signature Grant of \$50,000 will help to restore the lobby and concession to reflect not only the glory of yesteryear but the functionality of the future for this community centre for film and performing arts. The Broadway Theatre's renovation project is titled “Back to the Future” and the plans are based on the original designs for the Theatre, while incorporating modern equipment, technology and convenience to serve Saskatoon better now and in the future!

The Saskatoon Community Foundation grant supports the interdisciplinary care team that creates trust and rapport, key factors in good treatment and better outcomes for SWITCH clients.

### **OLIVER LODGE: RESIDENT COMFORT PROGRAM**

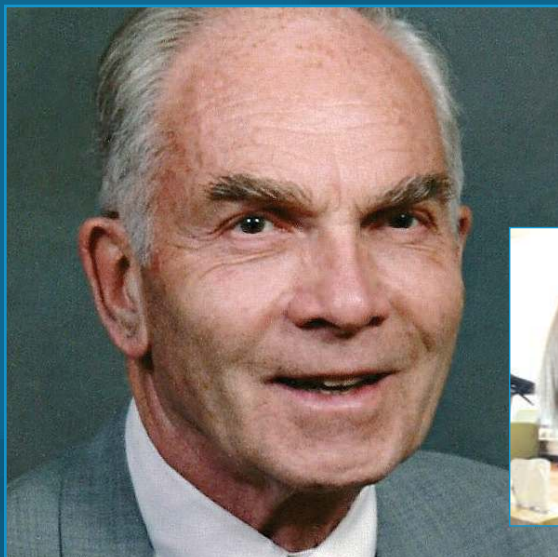

### RON & MURIEL BREMNER FAMILY FUND

Ronald and Muriel Bremner were married in 1949, arriving in Saskatoon from Ontario in 1954 with their 4 month-old daughter Margaret. After deciding to specialize in dermatology, Ron had learned that Saskatoon was the largest Canadian centre without a dermatologist and needed such a specialist for its newly established full-course medical school. He preferred not to practice medicine in a big city such as Toronto. "I figured I couldn't miss," muses Ron about his decision to venture west.

Saskatoon was good to the Bremners. Their children, Margaret and Murray, grew and thrived. Ron continued working in his private practice until 1990. Over seventeen years, Ron taught part-time at the University of Saskatchewan, within Medicine, Nursing, and other disciplines. He was able to travel extensively throughout the world, presenting scientific papers and working alongside local doctors to improve the health of the local residents.

The couple quickly became involved in their new community. In 1955, along with Frank Roy and Stuart Houston, Ron founded the Saskatoon Natural History Society, now called the Saskatoon Nature Society. Muriel found time to work with the Girl Guide movement and UNICEF. Both found pleasure volunteering their time with groups concerned with nature and the environment. As Muriel explains, "We always enjoyed the outdoors. If we took an interest in something, we started attending meetings and getting involved."

Religion was a mainstay in both Muriel's and Ron's lives. "The Presbyterian Church was a big influence in my life," said Ron. "Often, in Toronto, our family would walk to the church three times on a Sunday. It was a religious, educational, and social centre for our family." Muriel echoed Ron's sentiment that the Church and charity were important in her life: "Our patterns in life were set quite early. In

our household you worked hard, shared and didn't waste. And you thought of others first."

The Bremners enjoyed their life in Saskatoon. "We have been very fortunate. Our philosophy has always been to live a good life and share what you can with the people around you. We have gained so much from the people we have met and worked with," stated Muriel. "We don't need a lot of things. I don't need 30 pairs of shoes. I'd rather share with others."

Ron died in 2011, while Muriel passed in 2014. Through a gift of life insurance (as well as gifts made during their lives), the Bremners have donated over \$1.5 million to the Saskatoon Community Foundation, with significant gifts flowing through to World Wildlife Fund, Saskatoon City Hospital Foundation and the Presbyterian Church. The income from their fund will be granted annually to 35 charities, primarily religious or nature-based. As Ron explained, "Working with the Saskatoon Community Foundation was an attractive way to make a contribution which at the same time, allowed us to designate the future beneficiaries."

### ANN NICK SHURMA FUND

Both Leon and Ollie Mazurek grew up in farming families. Leon's parents, Stanley and Christina Mazurek, immigrated to Canada from Poland. Under the Dominion Lands Act, in 1927, Stanley purchased the homestead for \$10.00. Ollie's parents, Nick & Ann Shurma, emigrated from Ukraine, also purchasing their own \$10.00 homestead. Farms were critical multitasking, work-intensive affairs: a Ukrainian phrase in translation defines their motivation as "no work means no eat."

Ollie and Leon walked three miles to the little red school houses that permeated the prairie, icons of the times, with eight grades and youthful teachers as the norm. Ollie attended Lancaster School near Krydor and Leon attended Cosmos I & II near Carrot River. Encouraged by parents and teachers both left for Saskatoon for further schooling. They met, and married at St. Joseph's on Broadway Avenue, in Saskatoon.

Ollie attended Business College and became a secretary and breadwinner, while Leon attended the University of Saskatchewan, obtaining his Bachelor of Arts, Medical doctorate and Internship. Postgraduate training followed at the Sunnybrook Health Centre in Toronto and at Queens in Kingston, Ontario. This led to a specialty in Internal Medicine and an FRCP[C] [Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians]. In 1959 Leon joined the military where he served for 25 years as a medical doctor and specialist, achieving a rank of Colonel. They later ran a medical practice in Cold Lake. They returned to Saskatoon for retirement.

They both believe that education was the key to their successful lives, opening many doors, including travel: moonlit operas on the canals of Venice, visiting the Mona Lisa, the Eiffel Tower, the leaning tower of Pisa, the cliffs of Petra, the Sinai wilderness of Moses, and the Egyptian cemeteries of the Al Alamayn.

From humble beginnings, our community offered many opportunities to the Mazureks. They created the Ann Nick Shurma Fund to honour those beginnings. The income from the fund will go to the church in Hafford to assist in maintaining the grave sites of Ollie's parents, the Shurmas. The Mazureks also have plans to establish a fund to support education through a planned gift later on.

## WILLIAM (BILL) COOPER ENTREPRENEURSHIP STUDENT AWARD

Bill grew up in a family of 7 siblings and was always taught to help others as a matter of course. His career in farming helped to fuel that sense of community. Working at the university he learned to value the experience and understanding that education brings.

Through his years as the Executive Director at the

Saskatchewan Canola Growers Association he could see the impact 4H was able to make on the leaders of tomorrow.

The annual income from this fund is forwarded to the 4H Council for use in its student awards programs. Bill has been supporting the

4H council with an endowment for about 5 or 6 years. The William (Bill) Cooper Entrepreneurship Student Award was established at the Saskatoon Community Foundation to complement the original fund.



The goal of all the funds is to support the next generation of leaders. Bill believes in the influence 4H can have and how important it is to be community minded and to take action. Funding these beliefs was always part of Bill's plan, but moved from a will bequest to be within his lifetime when it became advantageous from a tax perspective to donate securities. Mr. Cooper says he is very happy with this decision because now he can enjoy the giving process and see his philanthropy at work.

## GERALDINE & MURRAY DICKSON STUDENT AWARD & FIELD OF INTEREST FUND

Gerri and Murray are health professionals whose health careers have taken them all over the world. Their travels had allowed them to experience life in developing countries through placements in Nigeria, Papua New Guinea and Mozambique. While at home their two adopted First Nations sons also provided an opportunity to live cross-culturally.

Both Gerri and Murray, through their faculty appointments at the University of Saskatchewan, were able to coordinate international projects. Their focus was to assist the Mozambique's Ministry of Health in preparing the state cadres of health teachers, primary care practitioners and community health activists.

First Nations and Metis of Saskatchewan have been a loving focus of the Dicksons, with their adopted sons being of First Nations decent. Gerri

also dedicated much of her career in the nursing field to Native Access Programs and she guided aboriginal grandmothers to take an active role in health care through Sharing Our Health Circle: The Grandmothers' Health Assessment Report.



The Dicksons hope that these funds, the student award and field of interest fund, will help more First Nations and Metis enter the field of Health Sciences in post-secondary institutions here in Saskatchewan. They believe cross-cultural learning encourages integrated learning (head,

hands and heart) which benefit not only those involved but the institution itself. Both of the Dicksons' funds are to be established via a bequest from their estate.

## MICHAEL C. SIFTON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Sifton family has a long association with Saskatchewan's newspaper industry. Sir Clifford Sifton founded the Sifton newspaper dynasty in 1899 with his purchase of the Manitoba Free Press and later purchasing Saskatchewan's two daily papers: the Morning LEADER in Regina and The StarPhoenix in Saskatoon. Between 1928 and 1995, three generations of Siftons – Sir Clifford's son (Clifford Jr.), grandson (Michael C.), and great-grandson (Michael G.) became directly involved in running the Saskatchewan papers. In 1986, the Sifton family established an educational grant for students who intended to pursue postsecondary education. Following the passing of Michael C. Sifton in January of 1995, the educational grant was named in his honor: The Michael C. Sifton Memorial Scholarship Fund. The Sifton newspaper dynasty in Saskatchewan ended in 1995, when they sold its two Saskatchewan papers to Hollinger Inc.



The Michael C. Sifton Memorial Scholarship Fund was established to be awarded annually to a graduating student who intends to pursue post-secondary studies at the University of Saskatchewan in the year following graduation with emphasis on community involvement.

Operating via the Saskatoon StarPhoenix for years, the fund was recently transferred to the Saskatoon Community Foundation for administration. The annual application for this award can now be found on the University of Saskatchewan's Scholarship site.

## ONIRO FUND

Randy and Effie Penner created the ONIRO Fund to honour their love of our community and support for youth. Not all youth in our community have the same opportunities. Economic challenges and even location can impact their chance to participate in activities that can contribute to their development into adults.

Randy Penner has been involved in the construction industry for 30 years. His ingenuity, creativity, attention to detail and love of design have allowed him to develop unique high end homes. Family is very important to Randy and Effie Penner, and they feel very blessed for their good fortune in that respect. Many weekends are spent travelling to Regina to partake in family functions and be present at nephews' soccer games, football games and concerts. Effie loves to volunteer and has volunteered in many

capacities, with local organizations such as the Greek community of Saskatoon, the United Way, Folkfest and Big Brothers Big Sisters among others. She was nominated for Citizen of the Year in 2000 and nominated for Women of Distinction awards in 2000 and 2015. Both Randy and Effie strongly believe in giving back to community.



The ONIRO Fund was created to give back to the community that has given so much to them, and to create opportunities for young people to develop to their full potential and be all that they can be. "ONIRO" is the Greek word for "Dream." The Penners would like to give youth the opportunity to achieve their dreams.

### B'NAI BRITH 2014 PAUL JASPAR WE'RE PROUD OF YOU! FUND

Paul Stephane Jaspar was born and raised in Prince Albert Saskatchewan. Paul knew as a child that he wanted to become an accountant, so it was a natural move for him to begin his career as an articling student with the local firm Tomney, Woodhouse and Co. soon after he graduated high school. After a few years of working in Prince Albert, he moved to Saskatoon to join the national firm of Price Waterhouse and Co. Paul obtained his Chartered Accountant's designation in 1971, and except for a brief time in Calgary, has spent his entire career in Saskatoon – a city he adores. Paul became a partner in the accounting firm Thomson Jaspar and Associates in 1981 and remained there until his retirement in December 2011. In 1988, Paul was honoured to receive a fellowship from the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Saskatchewan.

Paul has always believed that it is of utmost importance to give back to the community, and has made this his motto. He was a sessional lecturer at the University of Saskatchewan for 35 years in the Business Administration Certificate Program, taught at the Banff School of Advanced Management for several years, and has presented courses to groups such as the Law Society of Saskatchewan, Saskatchewan Real Estate Association and the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants, to name a few.

Some of Paul's past community involvements include being a member of the University of Saskatchewan Senate, Past President of the Saskatoon Jaycees and Past President of the Saskatoon Chartered Accountants Association. He has also served on the Board of the Saskatoon Public Library, Persephone Theatre and Saskatoon Folk Fest.

For the past three years, Paul has consulted to Envirotec Services Incorporated as its Chief Financial Officer, and he continues to be very

## LEADERSHIP AWARD: ROSANNE MORPHY OF FAMILY SERVICE SASKATOON

The Leadership Saskatoon program is a dynamic, 9-month adult education curriculum centred around "issue days" and community projects, and involving mentorship, readings, self-assessments, site visits, interviews with current leaders, seminars with guest speakers and experts, group discussions and projects. The Saskatoon Community Foundation's Leadership Saskatoon Award provides funding for a volunteer or staff member of a local charity to participate in the program, promoting leadership in the charitable sector.

Rosanne Morphy works with Family Service Saskatoon as a Domestic Violence Court Caseworker. She is a First Nations woman born in Chilliwack, B.C., a member of the Tzeachten First Nation. She has acquired a wide variety of skills and education throughout a diverse career. After completing a Clerk Steno II course, she began work with Adult Probation in Saskatoon. This led to further training as a Rehabilitation Worker working with youth who faced challenges in their homes and schools in the Yorkton area. After receiving her degree in Native Studies at U of S,

she worked for the Saskatoon Tribal Council as an Aboriginal Lifestyle support worker. Later, after completing her Social Work degree, she began working as a Domestic Violence Court Caseworker for FSS.



Rosanne brings a passion, a deep understanding of her personal and cultural history and a wealth of life experience to Family Service Saskatoon in support of families affected by domestic violence. According to Rosanne, "For me, the biggest reason to be involved in the Leadership Program is that life is a journey we all take. The journey involves not only learning information in both formal and informal ways, but also learning about yourself and how you fit into the world, and then passing on that passion and energy to those in the community around you."

In 2014, the following 5 charities created permanent endowments at SCF:**

## Saskatoon Council on Aging

---

The Saskatoon Council on Aging (SCOA) is a community based nonprofit organization dedicated to promoting positive aging for all members of our community. It strives to achieve its mission by providing programs and services to promote dignity, health and independence of older adults.

The Saskatoon Council on Aging envisions an environment in Saskatchewan that addresses the widespread prejudices of ageism; enhances the age-friendliness of our communities; enables healthy, positive aging and supports the well-being of older adults across the province.

## Saskatoon Jazz Society

---

The Saskatoon Jazz Society is a Saskatchewan not-for-profit organization dedicated to the development of jazz musicianship in players of all ages, from high school to adult, and all levels of playing ability, from beginner to professional with a local, regional and national focus. The SJS contributes to the health and sustainability of jazz and musical arts in Saskatoon, evidenced by the quality and quantity of musicians presented and cultivated within the city. The Society pursues its mandate through the development and presentation of a broad range of programs designed to meet a variety of needs and interests of musicians, educators, youth, membership and the public.

## Community Living Association Saskatoon Inc.

---

CLASI supports individuals with intellectual disabilities and their families through advocacy, services, and choices to enhance their lives. CLASI assists families in education, residential, employment placements, and transition planning for their family member with an intellectual disability. Activities of CLASI include: Respite Caregiver Registry, Parents Forever program for parents with intellectual disabilities, 1:1 Support Contract for youth in longterm foster care/Buddies Program for youth living at Parkridge Centre, Phoenix Club dances for adults, Monday Night Drama Program for teens and young adults, social/recreation clubs/summer camps for children, teens, and young adults, individual and family support, public education and awareness, and work with other agencies and government ministries to improve the lives of persons with intellectual disabilities.

## Gustin/Trounce Heritage Committee Inc.

---

The activity of Gustin/Trounce Heritage Committee Inc. ("Gustin House") is inspired by distinguished musician and piano teacher, Dr. Lyell Gustin (1895-1988), who was for 70 years a musical and cultural leader in Saskatoon, the province and nation. The Committee is mandated to present to local audiences classical music performances by fine national/international artists: Lyell Gustin Recital Series, comprising three concerts annually. Smaller-scale events in the restored Gustin Studios regularly bring together local and regional artists, writers and musicians with the public, providing a unique interdisciplinary context for presentation/performance and fostering connections across boundaries in the arts community.

In the spirit of Dr. Gustin, the Committee promotes musical formation of young people through scholarships and training in volunteerism. By interviewing Gustin Studio graduates--many of whom have gone on to professional music careers or roles in civic and cultural life across the continent--the Committee researches Dr. Gustin's pedagogy, and is establishing an archive documenting the development of cultural life in our city and province. Gustin House, a designated Provincial Heritage Property since 2008, is the artistic centre of the organization; the city's oldest building, Trounce House (1883), is on the same lot, and the Committee is responsible for management of these historic buildings.

## Junior Achievement of Saskatchewan

---

The purpose and mission of Junior Achievement of Saskatchewan is to teach financial literacy, work readiness, and entrepreneurship skills to the students of our province. JA accomplishes this by partnering with schools and the business community in order to provide in-school and after-school educational programming for students from Grade 3 to Grade 12. JA provides eight programs in Saskatchewan and reached nearly 20,000 students across the province during the 2013-2014 school year.

# INNOVATIVE COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

## KINSMEN LEARNING COMMONS

**The Saskatoon Community Foundation helps charities and service organizations to work together, serving our community effectively by focusing programs in areas of greatest need.**

The Saskatoon Community Foundation supports innovative partnerships which improve the quality of life in our community. One such partnership is with Kinsmen Learning Commons. Located in the core neighbourhood of Pleasant Hill, KLC brings together many agencies offering services that complement one another, a sort of “one stop shop” for the people of the area. Bringing charities together in a shared space creates synergies, reduces duplication and inefficiency, and helps clients to get what they need without having to navigate



many locations and parallel programs. Among the agencies that will share space at KLC are Junior Achievement, READ Saskatoon, and International Women of Saskatoon. By providing administrative support for KLC's fundraising campaign, SCF is helping to ensure that many of the more vulnerable people in our community are able to receive services in their own neighbourhood, greatly increasing the opportunities for positive change in their lives and in the community.

## FRIENDS OF THE BOWL FIELD GOAL CAMPAIGN

**The Saskatoon Community Foundation helps community groups that come together to ensure that we preserve our traditions while building positive change for the future.**

The Saskatoon Community Foundation supports improvements to civic facilities that benefit the entire community. The Friends of the Bowl Foundation formed recently with a goal of renewing Gordie Howe Bowl. The Bowl has long been a centre for developing outdoor sport in Saskatoon, but to truly bring Saskatoon in to a new era for sport, the Bowl needs to be upgraded. The Field Goal Campaign raises funds to install artificial turf instead of grass, better lighting, sound and scorekeeping equipment



and improved facilities for the whole community to use and enjoy. When the renovations are complete, Saskatoon will finally have a modern

CFL regulation football field. SCF can provide charitable receipts to citizens who wish to donate to the Campaign, and can forwards the proceeds to fund the project via the City of Saskatoon. Saskatoon Community Foundation is proud to be able to provide an innovative solution to achieve a community goal.

# INNOVATIVE COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

## WORLD PREMIERE OF CORNER GAS THE MOVIE

**The Saskatoon Community Foundation was proud to have assisted in the promotion of this iconic moment in Saskatchewan's culture, and to have been chosen as one of the charity recipients of the funds raised.**

This event was developed and brought to Saskatoon by former board member Bart Hunter and his lovely wife Cindy, and was supported by the staff at the Hunter Financial Group. Bart and Cindy bought the world premier rights to Corner Gas The Movie on their Kickstarter campaign. They decided to turn the event into a fundraiser for two of their favourite charities, the Saskatoon



City Hospital Foundation and the Saskatoon Community Foundation. (Bart has been a board member for both). On November 24th, 2014,

the event had an incredible turnout, with over 300 people in attendance. Also present were the movie's producers and stars Lorne Cardinal and, of course, Brent Butt. The Saskatoon Community Foundation handled the charitable receipts as over \$75,000 was raised for the two charities. A VIP event followed at the Ivy.

## JUST IN CASE

**Presented by Harold Empey, retired Federated Co-op Executive and 2011 Cornerstone of the Community Award recipient, this binder acts as a guide through finding and collecting the information that your executor and loved ones might need Just in Case.**

Many of us leave our loved ones with too little information. The Just in Case Binder and Seminars help to create an open dialogue about your wishes and work to educate people on the things that will need to be completed after you are gone. Many estate planning manuals deal with financial matters such as bank accounts and safe deposit keys, but "Just



in Case" takes planning to a new level of detail, offering suggestions on personal information such as computer passwords, dealing with treasured possessions, obituaries, and who to invite to your memorial.

The Saskatoon Community Foundation began modestly with an initial order of 300 binders. However, thanks especially to Harold's tireless promotion of the package on local radio and television, over 8000 binders have been distributed. It should go without saying that this program could not have existed without Harold's impressive commitment of time and energy. Our hope is that many more people will not only have wills, but also have their affairs in good order before they die.

## PAINT THE TOWN!

**The Saskatoon Community Foundation works to foster innovative partnerships that can benefit our community. In October of 2014, SCF partnered with PWM Community Fund Inc. to create the fundraiser “Paint the Town” in support of “The Leader in Me” program for schools.**

Paint the Town was a Pop-Up Art Gallery and Travel Auction held at TCU Place on October 24, 2014. PWM Community Fund Inc is a non-profit organization created by Kevin Hegedus, Kevin Haakensen, and Dana Mann in order to help fund “The Leader in Me.” To facilitate this process, PWM Community Fund Inc created a Social Capital Account at the Saskatoon Community Foundation. This enabled SCF to offer charitable receipts to supporters of Paint the Town. As well, SCF assisted with some fundraising and event management expertise. Over \$30,000.00 was raised, and the funds will



be used to help implement the program in select Saskatoon schools.

The Leader in Me is a whole-school transformation model that acts like the operating system of a computer—it improves the performance of all other programs. Based on The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People, The Leader in Me equips students with the self-confidence and skills they need to thrive in the 21<sup>st</sup>-century economy. Think what would be possible if schools were filled with students who were responsible, who showed initiative, who were creative, who knew how to set goals and meet them, who got along with people of various backgrounds and cultures, and who could

resolve conflicts and solve problems? Since 1999, The Leader in Me has been working to make that vision a reality in our schools, encouraging students to instill in themselves qualities like leadership, accountability, adaptability, initiative, communication, creativity, and teamwork.

## YOUTH ADVISORY COUNCIL

Created in 2004, Youth Endowment Saskatoon was originally known as the Batting 1000 Endowment for Children and Youth. The Saskatoon Community Foundation had partnered for several years before this with another funder to promote youth in philanthropy through a program known as Youth Granting for Youth. In the early 2000s, many donors gave to create the new fund and to continue SCF's commitment to funding projects for youth and to getting youth involved in philanthropy in our community. In 2014, the Youth Advisory Council made its 10<sup>th</sup> round of grants from the fund.

Our Youth Advisory Council members, who are sometimes known as YACs, are the dedicated young men and women between the ages of 14 and 19 who help to determine which youth programs will be supported by the Saskatoon Community Foundation

each year. YACs attend regular meetings to learn about community charities and decide on the types of projects that will be supported each year, based on the most important needs for youth in our community. They work together to plan fundraising and awareness events, and finally, they decide which community charities will receive grants! It's a big responsibility, but it's also a lot of fun! The Youth Advisory Council makes its grants from a special fund created to support youth projects: Youth Endowment Saskatoon.

Our Kindness Crew Supporter was SaskEnergy. SaskEnergy came on board with the #sharethewarmth campaign, provided some materials and volunteers, and helped us carry the spirit of Random Act of Kindness Day to the people of Saskatoon. We created a number of videos, which can be viewed on the Random Act of Kindness Day Facebook page. # YEAR IN REVIEW

New levels of community impact were achieved in 2014. Granting exceeded \$5,000,000. The previous record was \$2,000,000. Also, donations exceeded \$8,400,000 as compared to the previous record of \$4,700,000. While our traditional endowment model supports donors in providing for a permanent legacy, our business model allows the SCF to develop community partnerships that engage donors in the immediate needs of the community. The Friends of the Bowl Campaign in 2014 is an excellent example of a community partnership.

Our total grants since inception are almost \$20,000,000. Approximately 80% has been granted in the last ten years. Our assets now total over \$64,000,000 which is an increase of over 400% in the last ten years.

Net operating expenditures, after donations for administration and fee for service contracts offered by the Foundation, totaled \$524,530 and allowed the Foundation to maintain its administration fees at a low of 1.5%. The operation of the Foundation involves not only building endowments, but comprehensive activities related to strategic grant making and community leadership. These activities are not necessarily

related to the donations received in any one year, and endowment building methodology used by the Foundation creates normal gift delays, which may result in costs preceding the receipt of the gifts by several years. In the view of management, the ratio of operating expenses to total endowment should be used to evaluate the operational costs. Ratios may fall within a range depending on the size and stage of development of a community foundation. Management considers the ratio of 1.5% to

be within an acceptable range compared with benchmarks established in the community foundation movement, and continues to monitor both the actual results and the benchmarks on an ongoing basis. Community leadership represents the work of the Foundation to provide technical assistance to other philanthropic organizations and projects, as well as fostering the growth of community leadership.

## STEWARDSHIP YOUR INVESTMENT

Our responsibility as the manager of many different donor funds is something we take very seriously. We recognize that each donation, no matter the size, reflects trust in our ability to invest wisely and use the investment earnings in accordance with our donors' wishes.

Responsibility of managing our investment portfolio rests with the Board of Directors with the guidance and oversight of the Investment Committee. The Committee works closely with the professionals of Greystone Managed Investments to set policy, establish performance benchmarks and monitor the performance of our portfolio.

Our investment philosophy reflects the following objectives:

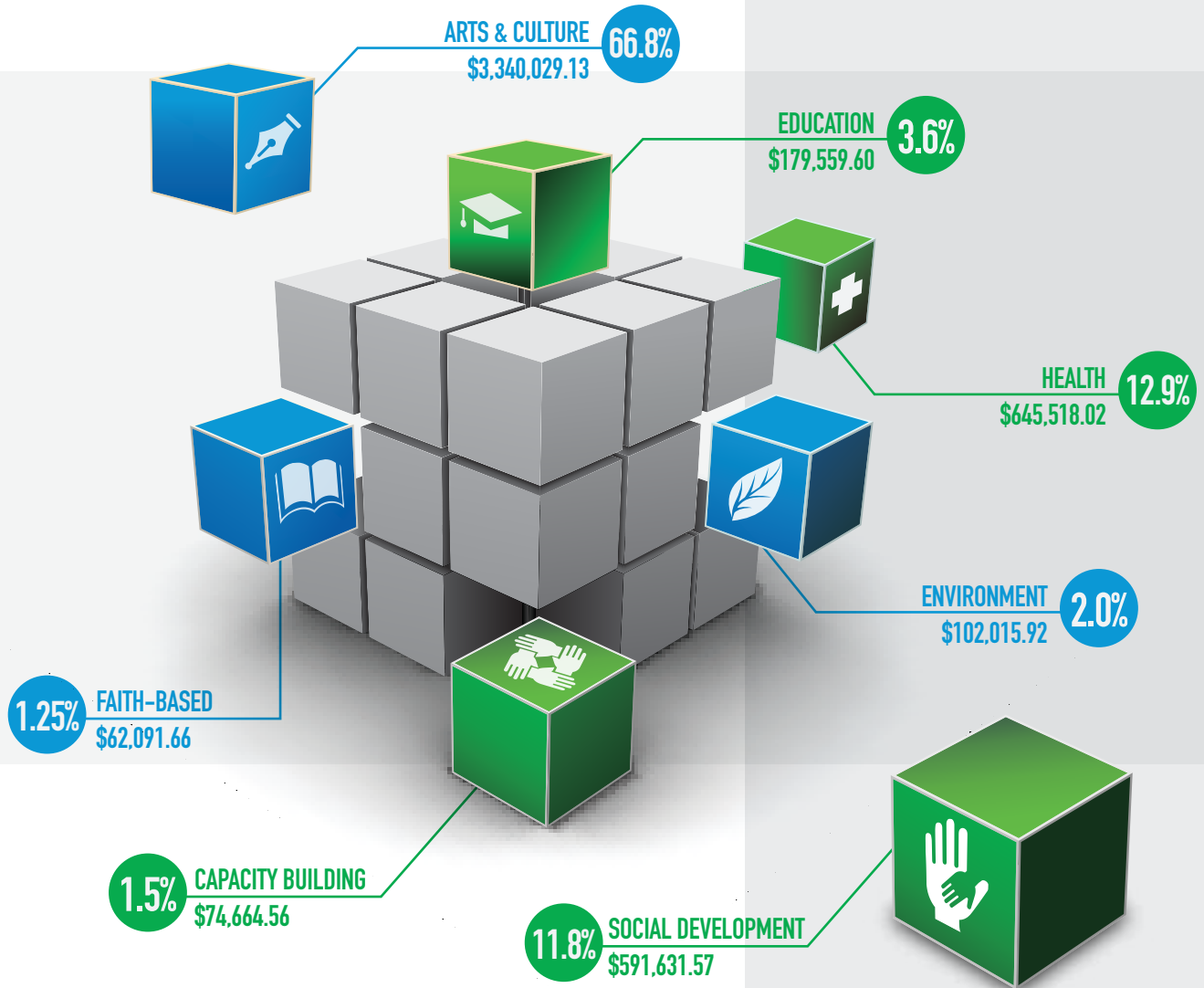
- Protect the capital of the fund
- Maintain a reserve for future declines in the market

- Achieve the granting objectives of the Foundation
- Recover the costs of managing and administering funds and providing donors with a wide array of philanthropic services
- Use an investment style that focuses on the long term

The SCF strives to maintain its diligent investment policy and has consistently exceeded market average. Our investments provided a 8.55% return for 2014, which brings our 10 year average to 7.1% per year. We are proud of the fact that among the approximately 193 community foundations in Canada, your local foundation has provided nearly the highest return over the past decade.

In fulfilling our fiduciary responsibilities, our goal is to obtain competitive total returns over the long term. This is accomplished through a strategic allocation of fixed assets among equities and fixed income securities.

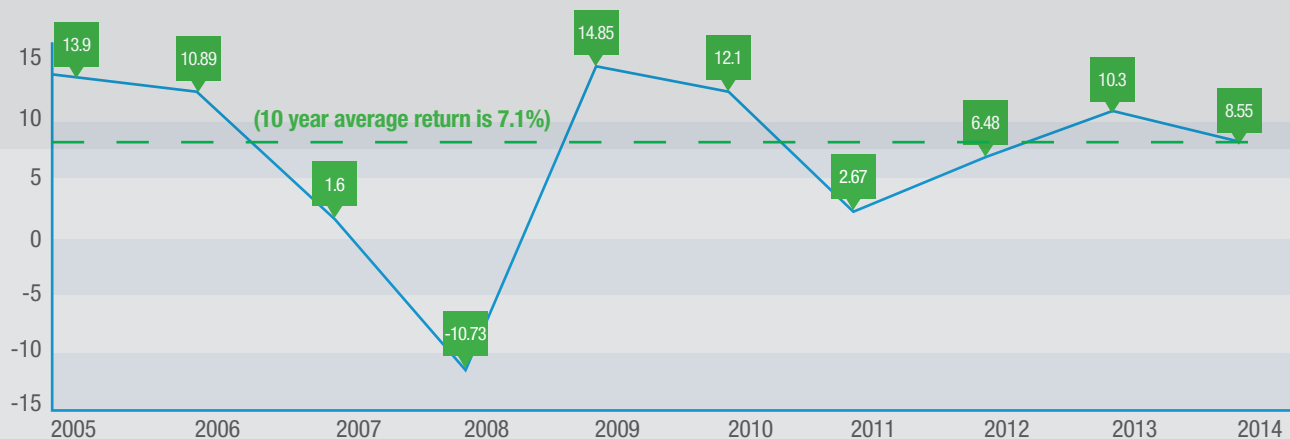

# TYPES OF FUNDS

## Unrestricted Funds

These provide the Foundation with the most flexibility in responding to grant applications. This type of fund is not tied to any specific agency or field of interest, which allows the Foundation to address pressing, changing needs of the community.

## Field of Interest Funds

These are established by donors who wish to support a specific charitable field of interest, such as arts, education, health, family and community, or the environment. Based on the donor's field of interest, the Foundation selects appropriate projects to support.

## Donor Designated Funds

These are established by donors to support one or more specific charitable organizations in perpetuity.

## Donor Advised Funds

These enable donors to be actively involved each year in recommending recipient charities.

## Student Awards

These are established in the name of a donor, or in honour of someone else, to help individuals receive education or training they might not otherwise be able to access.

## Agency Endowments

These are funds established by charities to generate annual income for their use.

## Managed Funds

These are also established by charities, but are not endowed. The funds can be withdrawn at any time, but benefit from being part of the larger pool of investments.

## Community Builders

Community Builders are donors who make deferred gifts—a life insurance policy, a charitable trust, or a bequest by will. Although the gift is deferred, tax benefits can be immediate.

## Flow Through Funds

Flow through funds are not endowed. Donors may flow funds through the Foundation to the cause of their choice following Canada Revenue Agency regulations. We award flow through grants on behalf of individuals, families, or businesses.

## The Saskatoon Fund

The Saskatoon Fund, home to our memorial, tribute and Century Club donations, is one of the many funds that make up our Unrestricted Fund. Memorial and tribute gifts allow friends and family to donate in memory or in honour of a loved one. Century Club is the club for “everyday philanthropists.” Launched by Ross Pinder in 1982 to recognize Saskatoon's 100<sup>th</sup> birthday, Century Club members commit to donate at least \$100 a year.

## How Can I Build One of My Own?

We can help you with your building plan. When you decide to establish an endowment fund with the Saskatoon Community Foundation, you are making a lasting commitment to the community. You can make gifts of cash, a designation in your will, a life insurance policy, real estate, or a gift of appreciated publicly traded securities. These gifts to the Foundation are invested in perpetuity with the income granted to charitable organizations. This means your original gift will make an impact in the community today, tomorrow, and forever.

Saskatoon Community Foundation is a charity itself with ongoing expenses. Contributors to the Administrative Endowment recognize the importance of building the Foundations' capacity to lead and serve the community.
