**Description:** Beginning in 2024, Vital Focus grants aligns the Foundation's granting focus with Vital Signs<sup>®</sup> Report. Areas of focus may shift over time, based on the outcomes of the Vital Signs data gathering process and priorities for areas of focus /interest as determined by the Board of Directors.

Vital Focus grants promote deeper relationships, greater impact, and upstream change by strategically supporting longer funding commitments of 3 to 5 years. Outcomes and trends are tracked over longer periods, ensuring that vital projects are not interrupted by funding gaps and reducing the development burden on partner organizations.

Decision	<ul> <li>LOIs: Vital Focus Grants Sub-Committee (consisting of 3 members of the Grants Committee plus invited experts) vets LOIs and approves the LOIs which will move forward to the Discovery session. Vital Focus Grants Sub-Committee identifies viable projects that could be invited to re-apply next cycle, given that few will be approved each cycle.</li> <li>Discovery: Management and applicants discuss projects to further define focus.</li> <li>Requests for Full Application: Based on outcomes from the discovery session, management makes recommendations to Vital Focus Grants Sub-Committee for full applications. Vital Focus Grants Sub-Committee approves requests for full applications.</li> <li>Applications: Vital Focus Grants Sub-Committee Recommendations to Grants Committee. Grants Committee makes recommendations to Board of Directors. Approval by Board of Directors (Spring meeting)</li> </ul>
